

MANDATORY DECLARATION OF HS CODE

The HS CODE (Harmonized System) or Customs Tariff is a classification system and specifies a product with a 8-digit code for tax reporting. Announced by The World Customs Organization (WCO) was formed by the cooperation of members of more than 176 countries and Thailand joined on 4 February 1972 and the system was accepted by the World Trade Organization. Organization: WTO) has therefore been adopted as an international trade.

- **THAILAND CUSTOMS:** HTS code Please kindly note that Thailand Customs now required 8 digits of HTS Code.
- **JAPAN CUSTOMS:** HTS code Please kindly note that Japan Customs required 6 digits of HTS Code.
- **MALAYSIA CUSTOMS:** HTS code Please kindly note that Malaysia Customs required 6 digits of HTS Code.
- **INDONESIA CUSTOMS:** HTS code Please kindly note that Malaysia Customs required 6 digits of HTS Code.
- **BANGLADESH CUSTOMS:** HTS code Please kindly note that Malaysia Customs required 8 digits of HTS Code.
- **VIETNAM CUSTOMS:** HTS code Please kindly note that Malaysia Customs required 6 digits of HTS Code.

For all the cargo imported to Yangtze River inland port via Shanghai, Shanghai customs requires that the manifest must contain HS code. Otherwise, the container will be inspected by customs

HS code must be at least 10 digits
